## THE EXODUS – A Story of Salvation.

In Exodus we see God beginning to fulfill His promises to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Exodus tells the dramatic and miraculous story of the liberation of the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt. The overall theme is redemption – how God delivered them and how God made them His special people.

### EACH DAY WHEN WE READ...

- 3. Think.** How does this passage fit into the big story of the Bible? What does it teach about God and His plans? Is there a promise to claim? An example to follow? Or an action or sin to avoid?

## LEVITICUS - Getting to Know God and Atonement.

The book of Leviticus outlines the Hebrew laws for worshipping God in the Holy Tabernacle. God established the sacrificial system so that His people might enjoy His fellowship through worship, repentance and renewal. We will read through most of the book of Leviticus later in the Reading Plan.

Day 29 **Leviticus 19** How to worship God.

## NUMBERS – Suffering in the Wilderness – Not Believing in God’s Promise.

The theme of the book of Numbers is the journey from Mt Sinai to the Promised Land of Canaan. The wilderness was never meant to be Israel’s destination. A few examples of God’s care during this journey. We will read the rest of the book of Numbers later in the Reading Plan.

Day 30 **Numbers 13-14** Spies are sent into Canaan, lack of faith and rebellion.

Day 31 **Numbers 20-22** Grumbling, water, serpents, and God’s rebuke.

## DEUTERONOMY – The Story of Redemption.

Deuteronomy means ‘second law’ and in this book Moses gives the new generation a recap of the laws in Exodus, including the Ten Commandments, some of the experiences in the wilderness and how to love and obey God in the Promised Land. If they are faithful and follow God’s plan, these are the blessings, if not there are consequences for our actions. We will read the rest of Deuteronomy later in the Reading Plan.

Day 32 **Deut. 1,5,6** Moses remembers the spies and the commandments.

Day 33 **Deut. 28-30** Blessings, curses and a promise.

## I SAMUEL & II SAMUEL – The Story of David and a Close Relationship with God.

The two books of Samuel begin with the story of the prophet, Samuel for whom the books are named after. It then tells the beginning of the kings of Israel, the ill-fated Saul and the shepherd boy who became a king.

Day 34 **I Samuel 1-3** Hannah prays for a child, Samuel is called by God.

Day 35 **I Samuel 4-6** The Ark of the Covenant.

Day 36 **I Samuel 7-8** Samuel as a judge for the people of Israel.

Day 37 **I Samuel 9-11** Saul is chosen as the first king of Israel.

Day 38 **I Samuel 12-15** God rejects Saul.

Day 39 **I Samuel 16-18** God chooses David, Goliath, conflict with Saul.

Day 40 **I Samuel 19-21** David flees from Saul.

Day 41 **I Samuel 22-24** David and Saul.

Day 42 **I Samuel 25-27** David and Abigail, more conflict with Saul.

Day 43 **I Samuel 28-31** David has victory, the death of Saul.

Day 44 **II Samuel 1-3** David mourns for Saul and discord.

Day 45 **II Samuel 4-6** David becomes king, the Ark of the Covenant arrives.

Day 46 **II Samuel 7-10** God’s covenant with David, Mephibosheth and wars.

Day 47 **II Samuel 11-12** David’s sin and repentance.

Day 48 **II Samuel 13-16** Absalom’s rebellion.

Day 49 **II Samuel 17-19** The defeat of Absalom and David restored.

Day 50 **II Samuel 20-21** Rebellion of Sheba and a famine.

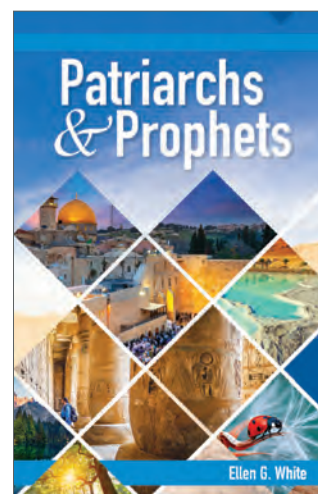

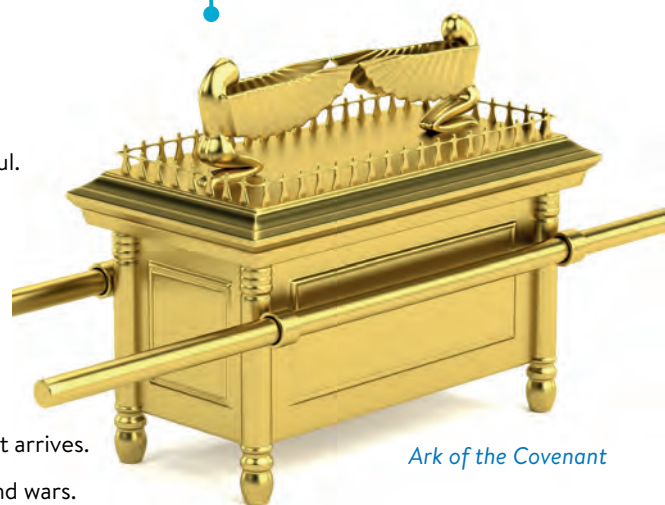

## II KINGS

II Kings outlines the kings of Judah and Israel and connects their unfaithfulness to God with their destruction.

Day 52 **II Kings 24, 25** The fall of Jerusalem.

## DANIEL 1-6 - Finding God and Standing Strong.

The book of Daniel is divided into two parts - historical and prophetic. During a period of judgement, Daniel shows that God is the sovereign power in the world, even over the foreign rulers. We will look at the prophetic chapters later in the Reading Plan.

- Day 53 **Daniel 1** Jerusalem is besieged, captives taken to Babylon.
- Daniel 2** The King's Dream About the Future.
- Day 54 **Daniel 3** Faith in the Flames of a Fiery Furnace.
- Daniel 4** The King Goes Crazy and Eats Grass.
- Day 55 **Daniel 5** The Writing on the Wall.
- Daniel 6** Daniel Survives the Lions' Den.

## NEHEMIAH - The Rebuilding of the Wall in Jerusalem.

Nehemiah served the Persian King before leading a group of Jews back to Jerusalem to rebuild the walls. He led them back to faithfulness and worship of God.

- Day 56 **Nehemiah 1-3** Nehemiah's prayer, makes plans to rebuild the walls.
- Day 57 **Nehemiah 4-6** Some try to stop the work but the walls are completed.
- Day 58 **Nehemiah 7-9** A revival.
- Day 59 **Nehemiah 10-13** A covenant with God.

## JEREMIAH - Warning Against Rebellion and a New Promise.

The theme of the book of Jeremiah is judgement. Jeremiah prophesied about the judgement coming to Judah because of their unbelief and disobedience. He foretold the exile to Babylon but also the new promise that God intended to make once Jesus came to this earth.

Day 60 **Jeremiah 25,30-33** Exile, Restoration & a Promise.



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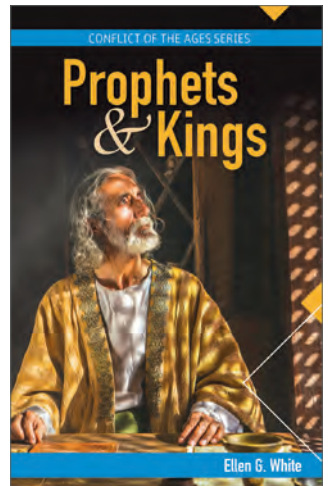

## THE GOSPELS

The Roman Empire occupied Palestine in the first century, at the time when the events in these books happened. The word 'gospel' originally meant the good news of the Christian message of hope and the coming of Jesus Christ. Today the word is also used to reference the first four books of the New Testament: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. These books all recount the life of Jesus on Earth from their perspective. These gospels tell us that everyone has the opportunity to accept Jesus' love and the plan of salvation and redemption.

### MATTHEW - Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah.

The book of Matthew gives a Jewish perspective on the life and ministry of Jesus. Matthew regularly refers to the Hebrew prophets in the Old Testament to identify Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah.

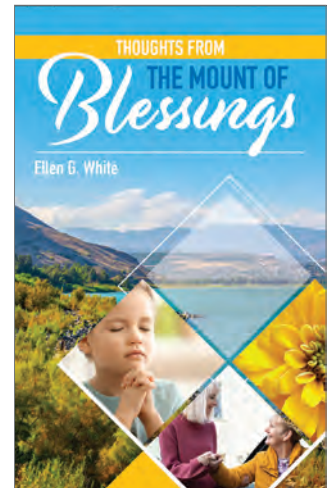

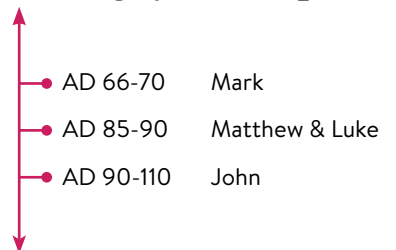

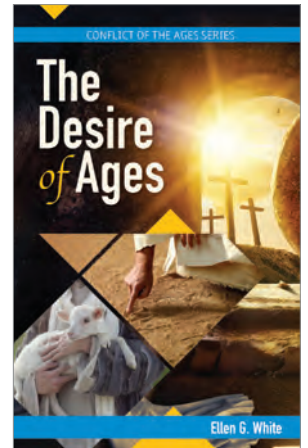

We return to the Historical books in the Old Testament also known as the Hebrew Bible.

## JOSHUA - Following God's Commands.

The name Joshua means 'Yahweh saves'. Yahweh being the Hebrew name for God in the Bible. The book follows on from the death of Moses in Deuteronomy 34. Joshua followed God's commands and led the children of Israel on the victorious conquest of the Promised Land. One of the most loved and encouraging verses in the Bible is Joshua 1:9, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

## JUDGES - Leaders of Israel.

The Judges were men and women who guided Israel after the death of Joshua until Saul was crowned king. It was a time of great upheaval and conflict in the land with some of the most violent scenes in the Scriptures occurring because of the people disobeying God's commands.

## I KINGS - Some Kings who Followed God's Way.

Scholars suggest that I & II Kings were completed during the exile in Babylon. These books were written to not only record history but to learn from the events in history. Each king is evaluated: whether he did evil or whether he did what was right in the sight of the Lord. We see the kings' faithfulness and the nation's destiny through the eyes of the prophets or God's spokesmen. Also, we find out how the kingdom was divided into Israel and Judah.

## II KINGS - A Nation Divided.

The kingdom is divided and attacked by foreign powers. Despite warnings from the prophets, the kings lead the people into apostasy and eventual destruction. This book shows that actions have consequences and ends with the predicted exile to Babylon.

*Model of the Temple in Jerusalem*



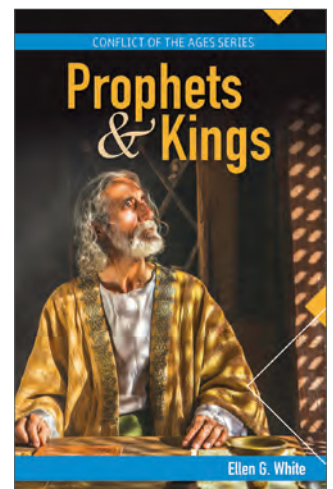

## I CHRONICLES - The Genealogies and the Retelling of the History of Israel.

I Chronicles lists the genealogies from Adam to the tribes of Israel and offers a priestly perspective of the history of Israel during the reign of the kings, II Samuel and I & II Kings. The Chronicles were written after the time of exile to Babylon and present the history that God wanted the returning Jews to remember.

## II CHRONICLES - Solomon & the Northern Tribes Secede.

The book of II Chronicles begins with King Solomon reigning over a unified nation and the building of the first Temple. It tells the story of how the nation is divided under Solomon's son, Rehoboam. 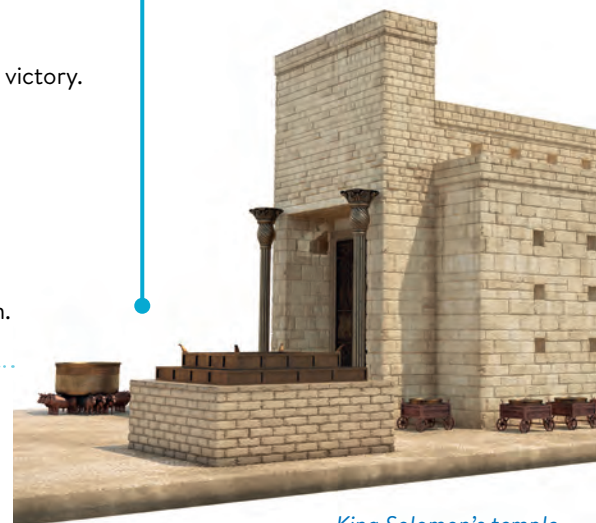

Esther, the name meaning 'a star', is the last historical book in the Bible and is the story of Esther, the orphaned Jewish girl who became the Queen of the Persian king, Ahasuerus, the son of Darius I, and ruler over the Persian empire from India to Ethiopia. This book gives us a glimpse into the court life and traditions of the Persian empire during the time between the chapters of Ezra 6 and 7 in the city of Susa, the capital of Persia, which is now in modern day Iran. This is a story of God's faithfulness and protection during difficult times.

## THE BOOKS OF WISDOM

There are five poetic books, Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon, that Bible scholars consider as a link between the historical books and the prophetic books.

## JOB - Faith Severely Tested.

Job is one of the best-known characters in the Bible and it is believed he lived during the time of the patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. The book of Job is written by Moses in the Hebrew style of poetry which involves repetition and the combination of ideas. Job's story of undeserved suffering, pain and loss touches most of us and we ask the age-old questions, why does God allow suffering? Why do bad things happen to good people?

## PSALMS - Songs of Praise.

The word, Psalms means 'songs of praise' and these sacred poems or songs were written to encourage the people to worship God. Their primary poetic device was parallelism – where an idea is developed by restatement, synonym, amplification, repetition or opposition. The Psalms are divided into five sections that recount and reflect on the history of Israel and points to the hope that you can find in God.

### Section One – PSALM 1-41

These psalms reflect David's life and his understanding of God. From the creation in Genesis, to the consequences of sin and the need of redemption, these psalms praise God for His love.

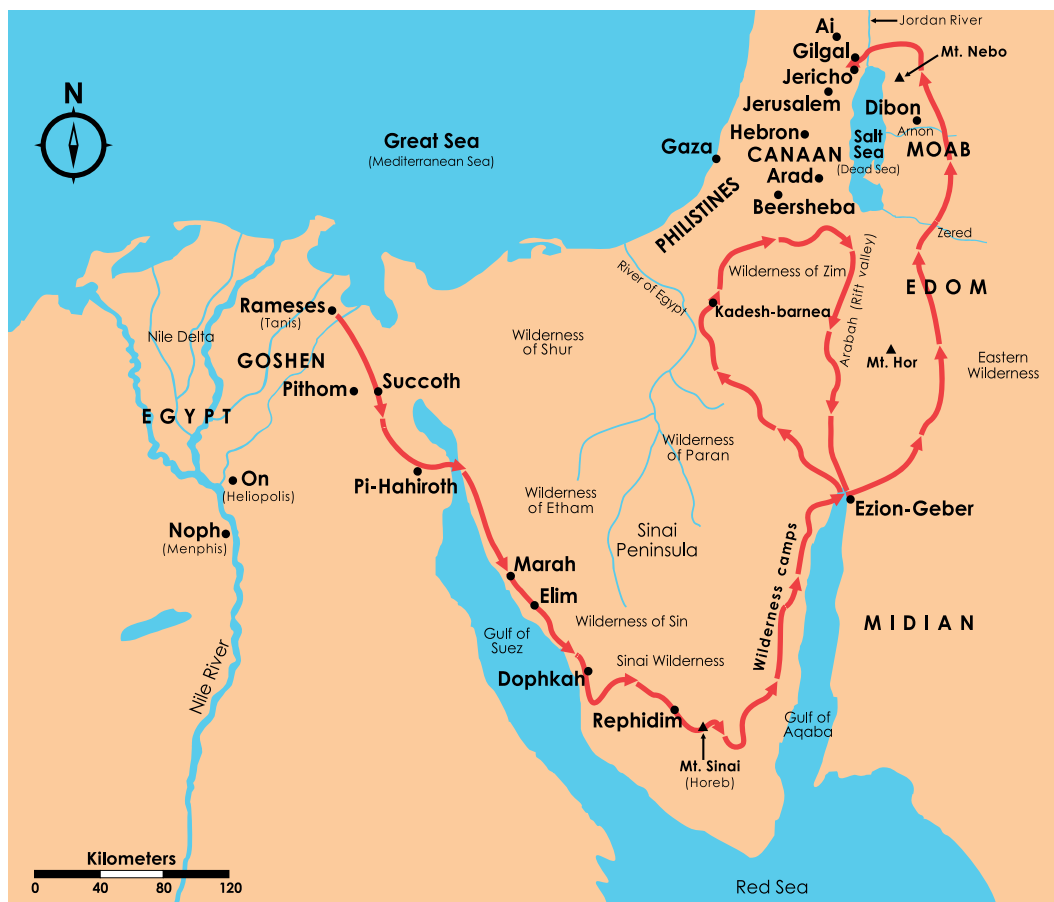
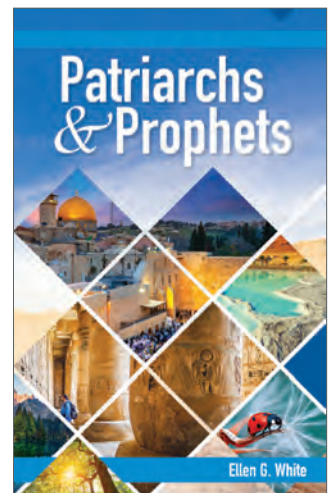

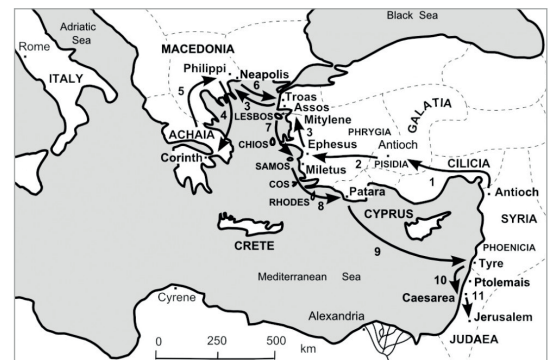

## II THESSALONIANS – *Encouraging words*

A second letter to encourage them in their trials and sufferings and to stand firm until the coming of Jesus.

Day 268 **II Thessalonians 1-3** A persecuted church & the coming of Jesus.

## I TIMOTHY – *Spiritual Leader*

Paul wrote this book to Timothy who was entrusted to lead the church in Ephesus. Paul encouraged the young man Timothy to have integrity and to be the spiritual leader in the church.

Day 269 **I Timothy 1-6** Paul's advice on leading the church.

## II TIMOTHY – *Staying Strong*

This is a personal letter from Paul to Timothy to encourage him to stay strong in his faith despite false teachings and godlessness.

Day 270 **II Timothy 1-4** Advice to a young pastor in perilous times.

## TITUS & PHILEMON – *Good advice*

Paul wrote the book of Titus to give instruction and encouragement to Titus for his work on the island of Crete. Whereas the book of Philemon is a letter also written by Paul to Philemon asking him to forgive his runaway slave, Onesimus, and to accept him as a brother.

Day 271 **Titus 1-3, Philemon 1** Titus' commission, Paul's plea to Philemon.

This book is the bridge between the Old Testament and the New Testament. Hebrews is about Jesus - the Saviour of the world. Hebrews Chapter 11 gives examples of those who trusted and followed God’s plan for their lives and is well known as the ‘faith’ chapter.

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## I PETER – Trust in God

This book was written by Peter to the early church, at the time when the Christians were being persecuted and Emperor Nero blamed the burning of the city of Rome on these Christians.

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## II PETER – A Warning

The apostle Peter wrote this letter to the church to warn them against false teachers and their teachings.

This letter was written by the apostle John from Ephesus. John wanted to encourage the people to remain faithful to the truth of Jesus and warned them that false teachers will come.

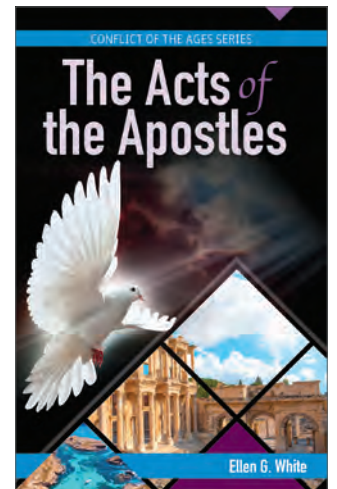

We will now go back to the Books of Prophecy in the Old Testament.

## ISAIAH – The Salvation of Yahweh

The book of Isaiah was written and named after the prophet, Isaiah who lived in Jerusalem. It spans the years 739-681 BC and at this time, Israel and Judah were in the middle of invasions and wars between three kingdoms: Egypt, Assyria, and Babylon. The story can also be read in II Kings 15-21 and II Chronicles 26-33.

Even though the people had turned away from God and would face judgment, God was faithful to His promise to provide a way of salvation with the coming of the Messiah. Isaiah is sometimes called the Gospel Prophet and in its pages we find the prediction of the birth of Jesus and the most comprehensive prophetic picture of Jesus.

### THE SEAL OF ISAIAH



The seal of Isaiah is an 8th century BC clay seal that was discovered in the First Temple remains near Temple Mount in the City of David in 2009 and is the earliest reference to Isaiah outside of the Bible. The seal is inscribed with the name, Yesha'yahu, the Hebrew word for Isaiah. In Bible Times, seals were used as signatures.

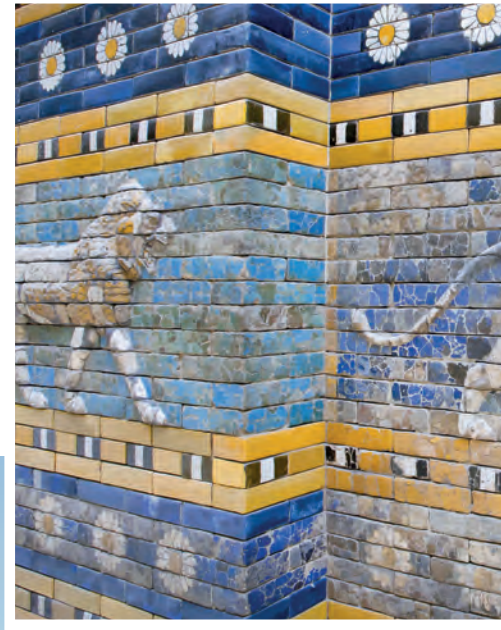

## LAMENTATIONS – *Despair for Jerusalem*

Bible scholars believe that Jeremiah wrote this collection of five poems lamenting the attack by the Babylonians and the fall of Jerusalem in 586 BC. The poetic images share the pain, humiliation, suffering and despair following the destruction of the holy city.

Day 319    **Lamentations 1-5**    From the desolation of Jerusalem to hope.

## EZEKIEL – *God Strengthens*

The prophetic book of Ezekiel was written by the priest, Ezekiel who lived with the Jewish captives at Tel-abib, on the River Chebar, south of Babylon. Ezekiel speaks to them of the judgment for their rebellion, the rebuilding of the Temple in Jerusalem, the glory of God, the restoration of the nation and the New Jerusalem.

The next 12 books in the Old Testament part of the Bible are known as the Minor Prophets. They foretold God's judgment on nations that rebelled against God.

## HOSEA – *The Weeping Prophet*

God tells Hosea to marry a prostitute. Although she leaves Hosea and returns to her former lifestyle, God tells him that he must bring her back to his house. Hosea told of the destruction of the northern kingdom. His name, Hosea means 'salvation' and this small book shows five cycles of God's judgment and His restoration of Israel.

- 597 B.C. - Treasure taken from the temple, and more captives taken to Babylon.*
- 586 B.C. – The fall of Jerusalem, the Temple destroyed and the kingdom was exiled.*

## JOEL – The Day of the Lord

Joel is the first book in the Bible to develop the theme of the day of the Lord, a day of judgment.

Day 340 **Joel 1-3** A plague of locusts & the day of the Lord.

## AMOS – A Shepherd Prophet

The prophet, Amos was a shepherd that lived near Jerusalem in the southern kingdom of Judah. Amos delivered his impassioned prophecy against the northern kingdom of Israel and the surrounding nations. Only the final five verses offer hope of restoration.

Day 341 **Amos 1-5** God's judgment of Israel, the coming captivity & exile.  
 Day 342 **Amos 6-9** The coming judgement and destruction, final restoration.

## OBADIAH – Judgment of Edom

The name Obadiah means 'worshipper or servant of Yahweh'. This single chapter book is unique as it does not focus on the judgment of Israel. Rather, Obadiah warns the neighbouring nation of Edom that they will be judged for plundering Jerusalem. The Edomites in the Bible were the descendants of Esau, the brother of Jacob, the father of the Israelites.

Day 343 **Obadiah 1** The judgment against Edom.

## JONAH – The Disobedient Prophet

Jonah, famous for being swallowed by a whale, came from a small town near Nazareth in the northern kingdom of Israel and was a contemporary of Amos. God asked Jonah to deliver a message to the people of Nineveh, the capital of Assyria, a nation known for their cruelty to captives. Jonah was unwilling to make the journey to the northeast, so he went to Joppa and boarded a ship to sail as far westward as he could to Tarshish in modern-day Spain. Although initially he was a disobedient prophet, Jonah did go to Nineveh and preached God's message of repentance to the city of Nineveh.

Day 344 **Jonah 1-4**

God calls, runs away, shipwrecked, in the belly of a fish, goes to Nineveh to preach God's message, the city repents.

## MICAH – Judgment and Restoration

Micah was a contemporary of Isaiah and Hosea and prophesied during the years around the tragic fall of Israel to the Assyrian empire in 722 BC. Micah admonishes the leaders of Israel and Judah. He prophesies the birth and birthplace of Jesus Christ.

Day 345 **Micah 1-3**

The coming judgment on Israel and Judah.

Day 346 **Micah 4-7**

Triumph & restoration, prophecy about Jesus' birth.

## NAHUM – Judgement on Nineveh

The book of Nahum written by a Hebrew prophet in the 7th century BC, foretells God's judgment on Nineveh, the capital of Assyria. Jonah had preached to the city of Nineveh 100 years before, but the city had slipped back into sinful ways. Nahum mentions the destruction of the Egyptian city, No Amon, or Thebes, in Nahum 3:8, and Thebes fell to the Assyrians in 663 BC. So, Nahum was written after that time and before Nineveh was destroyed 50 years later in 612 BC.

Day 347 **Nahum 1-3**

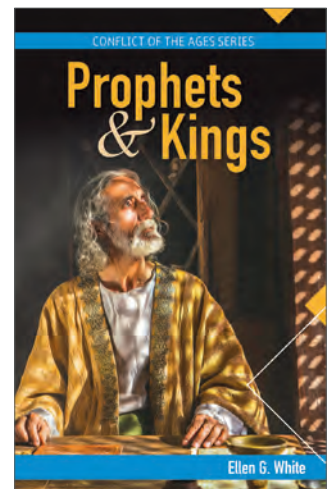

## HABAKKUK – A Frustrated Prophet

An exasperated prophet Habakkuk pleads with God to stop the violence and evil in Judah. When the time was right, Habakkuk is surprised to find that God uses the Babylonians to execute the justice on Judah. So, Habakkuk encourages believers to wait on the Lord.

Day 348 **Habakkuk 1-3** A dialogue with God about the evil in Judah.

## ZEPHANIAH – The Lord is my Strength

Zephaniah has a royal lineage, he is the great, great grandson of good king Hezekiah of Judah. Like the prophet, Joel, Zephaniah mentions the day of the Lord, a time of judgment that is coming. He predicts the destruction of his country by the Chaldeans or Babylonians, but like many of the other prophets he also says that after the judgment, God will restore peace and justice.

Day 349 **Zephaniah 1-3** Why does God delay judgment? God's response.

## HAGGAI – The Temple Rebuilt

Haggai wrote his four messages to the Jewish people in 520BC, eighteen years after their return to Jerusalem. Haggai had seen the nation captured by the Babylonians and now he desperately wants his people to rise up from the ashes, finish rebuilding the Temple and follow God.

Day 350 **Haggai 1-2** Haggai encourages the people to rebuild the Temple.

## ZECHARIAH – A Priest & a Prophet

The young prophet Zechariah was a Levite, born in Babylon and is a contemporary of the older prophet Haggai during the return of the exiles from Babylon. Zechariah wanted to encourage the struggling people to rebuild the Temple, to assure them of God's care for them and His promise to restore Jerusalem. The book of Zechariah also records prophetic symbolic visions and has the largest number of Messianic passages of Jesus' coming to Jerusalem and His second coming in the Minor Prophets.

Day 351 **Zechariah 1-5** Prophetic visions.

Day 352 **Zechariah 6-9** Visions & the judgment on Tyre, Sidon & other cities.

Day 353 **Zechariah 10-14** A promise, judgment & restoration.

## MALACHI – The Messenger

Malachi, as the final book in the Old Testament or Hebrew Writings is the culmination of the story of the covenant, the judgment and restoration. Malachi delivers the message to the people of Judah: they are to follow God faithfully and warns not only of the judgment from God but also the hope of the Messiah.

Day 354 **Malachi 1-4** God's love & the coming judgment.

## DANIEL 7-12 – Visions of the Future

The book of Daniel is one of the few books that was written during the time of the captivity in Babylon. The first six chapters recount the history of Daniel as a captive in Babylon. See Days 53-55. The last six chapters contain visions with symbolic beasts that represent the empires on earth and significant future events in the end times.

Day 355 **Daniel 7-8** Visions of the Four Beasts, the Ram and the Goat.

Day 356 **Daniel 9-10** Seventy weeks prophecy, the great conflict & redemption.

Day 357 **Daniel 11-12** A sequence of historical events.

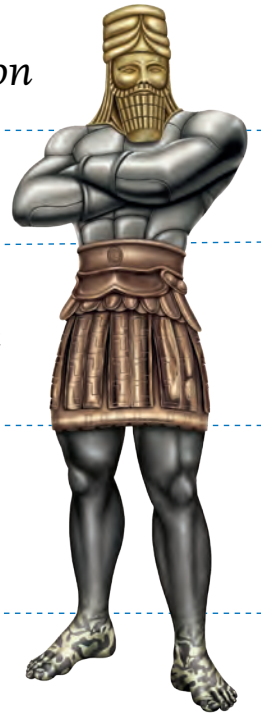

The book of Revelation was written by the Apostle John around the year AD 95 during his exile on the Island of Patmos. The title for this book comes from the Greek word for apocalypse. After the letters to the seven churches, John shares the visions of judgment and the final events on earth and then Jesus' final triumphal victory over sin and evil.

### The Women and the Dragon – Revelation 12:1-2

Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a garland of twelve stars. Then being with child, she cried out in labor and in pain to give birth.



### First Beast – Revelation 13:13

And I saw a beast rising out of the sea, with ten horns and seven heads, with ten diadems on its horns and blasphemous names on its heads. And the beast that I saw was like a leopard; its feet were like a bear's, and its mouth was like a lion's mouth.



### Second Beast – Revelation 13:11

Then I saw another beast rising out of the earth. It had two horns like a lamb and it spoke like a dragon.
